

SECOND GCC REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS

MUSCAT, OMAN

30 JUNE - JULY 3, 2019



Background

This is the Second Regional Workshop on International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS) organized by the Statistical Centre for the Cooperation Council for the Arab Countries of the Gulf ("GCC-Stat").

The first Regional Workshop on IMTS was organized jointly by the GCC-Stat and the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD) on February 7-10, 2016 in Muscat, Oman. In follow-up the recommendations of the first Regional Workshop on IMTS of February 7-10, 2016 in Muscat, Oman, the main goals of this second workshop on IMTS are to review the practices in the compilation of merchandise trade statistics and the implementation in the Member States of Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) - United Arab Emirates, Kingdom of Bahrain, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Sultanate of Oman, State of Qatar and State of Kuwait to implement the most recent internationally agreed recommendations on IMTS and to use the best possible data sources and improve their statistical compilation processes.

OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOPS

The main objectives of the workshop are:

- to guide participants on how to better use the internationally available guidance, especially the IMTS Concepts and Definitions 2010 (IMTS 2010¹) and the related Compilers Manual (IMTS 2010-CM²)
- to define best possible data sources, setting up adequate (or enforcing existing) collection systems, and improving statistical production processes;
- to provide training and guidance to participants on how to improve their trade data in line with the most up-to-date international standards, classifications and codes (HS-2017³ and 2015 GCC Customs Procedures⁴);
- to emphasize the need and benefits for GCC all countries to implement IMFs⁵ Special Data Dissemination Standard (SDDS) requirements for Merchandise Trade Data Coverage, Periodicity, and Timeliness;
- to raise awareness of participants on SDMX-IMTS artifacts including data structure, concepts and code lists; and in using latest SDMX tools to map their trade database in to SDMX-IMTS output.

- to introduce Data Quality Assessment Framework on Trade Statistics and the respective newly revised GCC questionnaire; to train the countries on respective on techniques to assess and improve the quality of trade data.

The discussion is to include theoretical as well as practical issues relating to the implementation of the IMTS 2010, and Compilers Manual (IMTS-CM) under the following topics:

- 1. Implementing IMTS 2010
- 2. Commodity classifications
- 3. Partner country and rules of origin.
- 4. Mirror statistics
- 5. Data quality and metadata
- 6. Data sources
- 7. Customs procedures and IMTS.
- 8. Data compilation
- 9. Exports and imports trade indices
- 10. Trade SDMX
- 11. Data dissemination
- 12. Other Miscellaneous

The workshop will include: presentations on conceptual and methodological issues, country practices, group discussions, as well as a field trip to a national customs administration (NCA).
